





First Responder Center for Excellence partners with FDNY and the FDNY Foundation

CROFTON, Md. — The First Responder Center for Excellence (FRCE), an affiliate organization of the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF), continues to partner with the Fire Department of New York (FDNY) and the FDNY Foundation to promote and assist in firefighter wellness and cancer prevention.

Recently, the FRCE funded six short training videos produced by the FDNY Bureau of Training. The goal of these videos is to further educate firefighters of simple actions they can take to reduce their risk of occupational cancer. The topics covered in the series include decontamination of gear and equipment, car and dumpster fires, children of firefighters, firefighter hoods, and reloading hose onto apparatus.

The FRCE intends to build on the video series, news that is welcomed by the FDNY. "This series of videos is designed to bring a greater awareness and mindfulness of simple tactical nuances that when adopted can equal big results" says FDNY Chief Frank Leeb.

The FRCE is also providing personal sunscreen containers for each of the members of the upcoming Probationary Fire School classes at the FDNY Fire Academy on Randall's Island. Skin cancer is one of the cancers that firefighters have a high risk of disease.

The FRCE has also supported the FDNY in their publication of "Reduce Your Risk," aimed at raising awareness of occupation-related cancers.

"Partnering with fire departments to help spread the message and educate firefighters is part of the core mission of the FRCE," says FRCE Managing Director Ed Klima.
