## 2021 National Firefighter Cancer Symposium

The Firefighter Cancer Initiative (FCI) and First Responder Center for Excellence (FRCE) joined forces to host a hybrid event: The 2021 National Firefighter Cancer Symposium. A public scientific conference that brought together academia, government, labor/management, and firefighters to support the reduction of cancer risk in the U.S. fire service. The event was a hybrid event, with both in-person attendees and presenters held June 10-12, 2021 in Kissimmee, Florida. With over 500+ attendees, the hybrid format likely increased attendance.



# FIRE SERVICE OCCUPATIONAL CANCER ALLIANCE MEETING

The Fire Service Occupational Cancer Alliance met on Saturday, June 12, 2021, in conjunction with the National Firefighter Cancer Symposium hosted by the University of Miami and the First Responder Center for Excellence to review the existing strategy. The alliance meeting was facilitated by the First Responder Center for Excellence. New areas identified to develop objectives include: marketing and issue relevance, reproductive health and effective presumptive legislation. Also discussed was the impact of IARC's scheduled timing of its report in June 2022. Two new areas were identified requiring task groups, including (1) marketing and issue relevance and (2) future symposiums.

#### Screening & Early Detection

• Early detection is key. We need to collect information for a study so it can be used to make recommendations for more advanced screenings.

#### Reproductive Health in Firefighters

• Study to look at reproductive health in firefighters.

#### Convene a task group to develop marketing strategies & look at funding to implement

- How to keep information relevant and in the forefront
- How to make messaging personal and powerful
- Using different social media platforms

#### **Future Symposiums**

- Every other year?
- In conjunction with University of Miami?
- Rotate locations?
- Possibly hold an Overall Health & Wellness Symposium to include behavioral health, cancer and health & wellness topics?





### LAVENDER RIBBON REPORT

In August 2018 the National Volunteer Fire
Council and International Association of Fire
Chiefs' Volunteer and Combination Officers Section
released the Lavender Ribbon Report - Best
Practices for Preventing Firefighter Cancer - 11
Actions to Mitigate the Risk of Cancer. This report
presented 11 specific actions firefighters need to
take to lessen their risk of occupational cancer.

### FIREFIGHTING FOAMS FIRE SERVICE ROADMAP PROJECT

The firefighting Foams Fire Service Roadmap project, (AFG funded) is planning a workshop in the fall of 2021. This project seeks to coordinate the needs of the fire service stakeholders to identify and move forward with foam replacements. This effort is motivated by the search for legitimate foams that are non-fluorinated, since the fluorinated foams are a cancer concern. (e.g., legacy AFFF).

The FRCE is represented on this project and the workshop. The workshop will be conducted in October. More details will follow as they become available.
